Rules & Regulations

1	Overview
1.1	The Yorkshire Netball Under 14 League and Under 16 League is a regional competition. The competition is organised by Yorkshire Netball to enable clubs to complete against each other to determine a regional winner, whilst encouraging participation and development in netball through an open, fair, progressive, and transparent competition structure.
	The winner and runner up in the Under 14 League and Under 16 League will be the club/team that goes forward to the England Netball National Club Finals (Under 14 or Under 16).
1.2	These regulations set out below the Rules and Regulations which govern the operation of the Yorkshire Netball Regional Junior League Under 14 and Yorkshire Netball Regional Junior League Under 16.
1.3	These regulations must be followed by all teams, players, officials, spectators, and administrators involved in the management, administration, and operation of the Yorkshire Netball Regional Junior League.
1.4	All clubs/teams will be held responsible for the behaviour, demeanour and actions of their Players, Team Officials, and spectators. Codes-of-conduct.pdf (d2cx26qpfwuhvu.cloudfront.net)
1.5	It is the responsibility of all Team Officials, not Yorkshire Netball to ensure that all players and relevant parties within the team are fully conversant with these regulations.

2.4 The maximum number of clubs in each Age group (based on the above) is Eight (8) who will compete in the Yorkshire Netball Regional Junior League Competition. The clubs/teams who will be invited to compete in the Yorkshire Netball Regional Junior League will be determined via a Qualifying Tournament held at the beginning of the season (see the rules and regulations for the Qualifying Tournament) 2.5 At the end of the season, the league (both age groups) will be disbanded, and a new league formed the following season. **Competition Organisation** 3 3.1 The competition and all rights and properties associated with it shall be owned, controlled, and managed by Yorkshire Netball, which may delegate its powers and authority in this respect to any sub-committee or individual(s) i.e., Working Group. 3.2 Yorkshire Netball is responsible for the organisation and management of the Yorkshire Netball Regional Junior League (Under 14 and Under 16), as well as the Yorkshire Netball Regional Junior League Playoff's. 3.3 The decisions of Yorkshire Netball, in respect of these rules and regulations and on any other matter related to the Regional Junior League, which is not provided for below, shall be considered final and binding on all parties (subject to the right of appeal which is specifically provided for under England Netball's Disciplinary Regulations). 3.3.1 Prior to the start of the Yorkshire Netball Regional Junior League, Yorkshire Netball shall announce the following. The Competition Referee and The person appointed to receive appeals of the decisions of the Competition Referee, as outlined in Section 8 3.4 Yorkshire Netball may alter the named Competition Referee during the Competition. If a change is made, Yorkshire Netball through its best endeavours will notify all teams. **Competition Referee** 4.1 The Competition Referee will be appointed by Yorkshire Netball for the Regional Junior League Competition (Under 14 and Under 16). 5.2	Player/Team Official Eligibility
5.2.1	In order to participate in the Regional League Competition all Players and Team Officials (see
	6.5 for details of Team officials) must be a member of England Netball as a personal
	adult/junior member participant, having paid the full membership fee due and received
	confirmation of their membership in advance of submitting the Squad Registration Sheet.

5.2.2	Under 14's - All players must be over ten (10) years of age and under the age of fourteen
	(14) years old as at 11.59pm on the 31 August immediately prior to the commencement of
	the playing season.

	Under 16's – All players must be over thirteen (13) years of age and under the age of sixteen
	(16) years old as at 11:59pm on the 31 August immediately prior to the commencement of
	the playing season. Players under the age of fourteen (14) must have completed the Age
	Banding Consent Form and submitted this alongside the Squad Registration Sheet.

5.2.3	All Team Managers must be over the age of eighteen (18) years old prior to the start of the
	Yorkshire Netball Regional Junior League.
5.2.4	During all matches of the Regional Junior League Competition, Team Managers must always
	carry proof of age for all players listed on the Squad Registration Sheet (this information may
	be held electronically).
5.2.5	Proof of age comprises of one or more of the following.
	Copy of birth certificate

	Copy of Passport
	Copy of PassportCopy of medical card
5.2.6	The Regional League Competition is a competition for female participants. Only female participants can be included on the squad registration sheet as a player. For more information on eligibility based on Gender, please visit the Trans Inclusion Guidance here
5.2.7	Yorkshire Netball recommends that individuals (player, coach, umpire) if pregnant should only participate with approval from their doctor and in accordance with any guidance issued by itself.
5.2.8	The England Netball personal accident insurance excludes any loss or expense due to pregnancy, childbirth, miscarriage, or any consequence thereof. If, for example a member who is pregnant is involved in an accident not related to the pregnancy, subject to the conditions of the policy, the relevant benefits would be payable. However, if any situation (such as hospitalisation) was prolonged as a direct result of pregnancy, pregnancy complications or even early childbirth, then this portion of any claim is not covered.
5.3	Registration of Squads
5.3.1	Participating clubs/teams must complete a squad registration sheet fully listing each player and their membership numbers. This needs to be lodged with the competition organiser one (1) week prior to the commencement of the Yorkshire Netball Regional Junior League.
5.3.2	Any additions to the Squad Registration Sheet, must be lodged with the competition working group (yncompetition@gmail.com) by 12.00noon on the Saturday prior to the match taking place.
	Registration of Additional Players will not be accepted after 12.00noon on the Saturday prior to the Regional Junior League week 12 (26 January 2025).
	This should be by completing the Additions to Squad Registration Sheet available via Dropbox and emailed to yncompetition@gmail.com
5.3.3	Teams may only use those Players whose names appear on their Squad Registration Sheets held by Yorkshire Netball (see Section 4.2 for the penalty breach for this)
5.3.4	A player may seek to transfer to another club/team after the start of the Yorkshire Netball Regional Junior League Competition.
	Transfer requests must be made in writing by email to yncompetition@gmail.com with both clubs copied into correspondence. The request must clearly outline why the request is being made. The request will then be considered, and a decision made (normally) within 14 days).
	If the request to transfer is approved, the player will not be eligible to compete at National Club Finals (see 5.3.6)
	Players will not be allowed to request to transfer to another club/team after Round 10.
5.3.5	Each team may declare up to twelve (12) Players prior to the start of each match by completing the Yorkshire Netball Results Sheet and submitting it to the Officials Bench.
5.3.6	For clubs going through to National Club Finals, the National Club Finals Rules and Regulations state the following (full rules and regulations are available on the website and Dropbox)

- **5.2.6.** If a Player was not named on the Squad Registration Sheet for the final feeder competition prior to the National Finals, the Club must provide evidence that the Player has played for the Club prior to the date of the final feeder competition. Failure to provide evidence will result in the player being ineligible.
- **5.2.7.** If the player was on the Squad Registration Sheet for another club in any of the feeder competitions, or for a club in a different Region's U14 National Club Competition, this would also make them ineligible.

And

- **5.2.9.** England Netball will conduct checks of each player on a team's registration form to check that they have only played for 1 team during the Competition Structure for this season's National Clubs Competition.
- **5.2.10.** For the avoidance of doubt, it is the responsibility of the team, not England Netball, to ensure that all players are eligible to compete.
- **5.2.11.** An ineligible player is defined as
 - **5.2.11.1.** A player who does not hold a Full England Netball Membership
 - **5.2.11.2.** A Player who is not included on the squad registration sheet.
 - **5.2.11.3.** A player who has previously played for another team in the competition at any stage (County or Regional).

Responsibility for ensuring that players taking the court meet the eligibility criteria specified rests solely with the relevant club/team. All eligibility checking by the Competition Working Group / Competition Referee will be undertaken by reviewing submitted results cards and squad registration sheets after matches have taken place.

5.4	Competition Venues
5.4.1	Matches must be played on an indoor court. The court should be made of an adequate
	playing surface (preferably wooden sprung) and preferably with adequate surrounds. If not
	sunken posts, the posts should be securely fixed to the floor with post protectors as
	standard.
5.4.2	All venues should have ancillary facilities, including changing facilities.
5.4.3	Yorkshire Netball are responsible for arranging the venue, teams will pay a match fee, which
	for the 2024/25 season is £30.00 per team per match. Fees can either be paid per fixture (in
	the week leading up to the fixture taking place) or in advance at the start of the season.
5.4.4	Each court will have a home and away designated benches where coaches, team officials
	and substitutes must sit. An official table area should also be provided where the scorers and
	timekeepers of both teams must be situated throughout the match.
	Spectators are not permitted to sit on the designated Team Bench.
5.5	Accidents

8.5	The chair of the CAC will send the appeal to the opposing team and any other team the CAC
	believe could be affected by the outcome of the appeal. These teams will be permitted
	seventy-two (72) hours, from the date that appeal notice is sent from the CAC to submit any
	evidence or submission that they wish the CAC to consider.
8.6	All submissions and evidence must be submitted in writing. The chair of the CAC will have
	the secretion to determine the process, procedure, and direction of the appeal.
8.7	The CAC shall meet and reach a determination within seventy-two (72) hours of receiving all
	the evidence and submissions.
8.8	The CAC will notify all the parties that made submissions and presented evidence of its
	decision and any penalties and sanctions imposed within twenty-four (24) hours of it
	reaching its determination. The CAC shall have discretion to publish the decision through
	whatever means it considers appropriate.
8.9	The CAC shall have the delegated power of Yorkshire Netball to make all decisions and
	impose and enforce any penalties and sanctions (but not limited to, reprimands, the
	deduction of points, fines, suspensions, and exclusion from the competition) relating to the
	appeal. There is no further right of appeal on the decision.
8.10	The procedures set out in this section shall be governed by the Arbitration Act 1996 (the act)
	and amount to a binding arbitration agreement for the purposes of section 6 of the Act.
8.11	The parties also waive irrevocably their right to any form of appeal, review or recourse to
	any court or other judicial authority, or under England Netball's Disciplinary Procedures
	Manual or otherwise, as far as such waiver may be validly made.
8.12	The seat of arbitration shall be England, the language shall be English and the governing law
	of the regulation and these proceedings under Section 8 shall be English Law.

8.13	If the circumstances require a decision to be taken sooner than provided for by this section 8, and all parties to the appeal consent, the timetable within which an appeal is raised, submissions made, and the decision taken can be shorter than seventy-two (72) hours stated in this section. In such cases the CAC shall issue a revised directions timetable which shall be binding on all parties
