

# Regional Tournament Referee

## Yorkshire Netball

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### Introduction

Yorkshire Regional Netball Association runs and supports several regional netball tournament events throughout the year. These events are a great way to volunteer in netball if you don't have the time to make a regular commitment to a club or organisation.

### Key responsibilities

1. Be fully conversant with World Netball Rules of the Game (2020) and the regulations that may apply for a particular competition, ensuring these are adhered to and provide clarity when they are questioned.
2. Make decision on any matters arising during the Competition and are authorised to adjudicate on

any matter not covered by the Competition Regulations

3. Administer the registration of all clubs/teams at the start of the competition ensuring that all entry conditions have been adhered to in accordance with the Competition Regulations
4. Understand and adhere to the accident reporting procedure.
5. Consult with additional people to assist with the Competition, but final decision and accountability will rest with the Competition Referee
6. Provide a written report to the Competition Organiser on all incidents that require them to enforce a rule and/or impose a penalty or make any decision that falls within their role
7. On the day of the tournament, check facilities (Health & Safety) and bring any concerns to the attention of the Competition Organiser
8. Conduct a meeting with team officials prior to the first match of the tournament to cover administrative matters including advising where score sheets should be taken at the conclusion of each match. Ensure that the current ranking of players is available for referees and assessors to consult (note that it might change during the event).
9. Ensure that the scoring procedure is applied in accordance with the competition regulations.

- Strong communicator
- A team player who can also work on own initiative
- Assertiveness and confidence
- Calm and effective demeanour in high pressure situations
- Display and encourage attitudes and behaviours that respect and value diversity and promote equal opportunities.

**The applicant must be a minimum of 18 years of age (at the point of application)**

### **Time Commitment and Location**

This is dependent on the location and timing of the event, but usually is 9.00 – 5.00pm and normally the English Institute of Sport, Sheffield
